Jonah: The Depths of Grace (Mark Oosting / Kitchen)
March 15 - April 26 The story of "Jonah and the Whale" is one of the most famous in the Bible, but its message is perhaps one of the most ignored. Its message has great relevance today for God's people, living in an increasingly non-Christian culture. Jonah's story will encourage believers who find themselves ill-equipped to share God's message with colleagues, friends and family; and it deeply challenges our priorities in life. But most of all this is a story about God, revealing to us the depths of His grace both to "outsiders" and to "insiders".

The Minor Prophets (Steve Lorah / Fellowship Hall)
March 15 - June 28 So often in the Church we pay very little attention to the twelve books that make up the Minor Prophets. Without context, these books can be difficult to understand and, as a result, Christians frequently miss the deep, rich truths in this portion of Scripture. This class will not be an in-depth study of these books, but rather a historical overview of the group. We will seek to place context around each of these books to aid in future in-depth study and, ultimately, to gain a deeper understanding of the character of God as He reveals himself through His prophets.

Psalm 67 (p.611)

Suggested Communion Prayers During the Bread:

Father, I confess that while I believe in you with my head, I have not trusted in you with my life. I have neglected your commands, have not done "whatever I do" to the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31). I have lived for myself. I chose sin. Father, I confess that while I have loved you, I did not always "love the brothers" (1 John 3:14), your people, the church. I have instead dismissed them or complained about them. At times, I may have insulted, slandered, gossiped about believers, or worse. Forgive me.

But your body was broken for "us," your church. Including me. Forgive me, O God, for these and other ways I have sinned.

During the Cup:

Father, I believe in Jesus Christ, your Son.

I believe that "Christ died for us," including me. (Romans 5:8)

I believe that my life is now "buried with him" in baptism and "raised" with Christ (Romans 6:4).

I believe that "there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus," including me. (Romans 8:1)

And I believe that "by a single offering for sins, he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified." (Hebrews 10:14)

As I take your cup, Jesus, I thank you, for the blood you shed for me.

Help me now to believe that "it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20).
